RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the permanent closure of all solid waste dump sites on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation is of great importance to the health and well being of the members of the White Mountain Apache Tribe and to the reservation environment; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Planning Department has secured funding through several sources to use for the closing of solid waste dump sites, one source being the Indian Health Service which has money that can be made available immediately for dump closure work; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribe desires to first close the inactive "Red Dust Rodeo Grounds" dump site in the community of Cibecue using Indian Health Service funds; and
- WHEREAS, to proceed with closure of the above referenced dump site requires the removal of fencing erected adjacent to the Elizabeth Gooday Williams property of Cibecue and access to land adjacent to this same property.
- BEIT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby directs that dump closure work should begin immediately at the Red Dust Rodeo Grounds dump site and that for this to take place, the fence erected adjacent to the Elizabeth Gooday Williams property, shall be removed immediately by the party which installed the fence, otherwise the fence will be removed by the party undertaking the dump closure work.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council that access adjacent to the Elizabeth Gooday Williams property will be allowed for all dump closure work.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council that upon conclusion of dump closure work, the legal boundaries of the Elizabeth Gooday Williams property shall be resurveyed and that future fence installations shall not exceed these surveyed boundaries.
