## RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the residents of Cedar Creek Community have agreed to have the old Cedar Creek Community building demolished as it will expand the JFK School field; and
- WHEREAS, the residents also request that the new community building be appraised by the Bureau of Indian Affairs so that it may be leased to the John F. Kennedy School; and
- WHEREAS, the residents recommend hat the old and new community building be tested for hazardous materials.
- BEIT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby agrees to the above recommendations of the residents of Cedar Creek Community.

The foregoing resolution was on <u>August 04, 1994</u>, duly adopted by a vote of <u>eight</u> for and <u>zero</u> against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article IV, Section 1 (a), (h), (i), (m), (n), (s), (t) and (u) of the Constitution of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe September 30, 1993, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on November 12, 1993, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
