## RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, Tribal Member Melva Tessay has come before the Tribal Council this date and advises that she requested a HIP home and was approved eligible for a HIP home two years ago, but at that time did not have a lot assignment so that she could not receive the house she requested; and
- WHEREAS, Ms. Tessay advises the Tribal Council that she now has a land assignment and requests that a HIP house be provided to her; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council concludes that Fort Apache Indian Agency Superintendent Ben Nuvamsa should be requested to follow through on Ms. Tessay's eligibility for a HIP house since she was qualified as eligible two years ago.
- **BE IT RESOLVED** by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby requests that Agency Superintendent Ben Nuvamsa follow up on Melva Tessay's request for a HIP home and that due consideration be given to the fact that Ms. Tessay qualified as eligible for a HIP home two years ago.

The foregoing resolution was on November 2, 1994, duly adopted by a vote of nine for and zero against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article IV, Section 1 (a), (i), (s), (t) and (u) of the Constitution of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe September 30, 1993, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on November 12, 1993, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
