RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe adopted Resolution No. 10-91-273 that approved execution of a 3 year P.L. 93-638 Contract with the Bureau of Indian Affairs to employ a person to monitor prescribed burning and associated smoke and forest regeneration on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation.
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Resource Monitor has provided valuable information to the White Mountain Apache Tribe which has improved the overall quality of the Prescribed Burning Program and identified areas in need of regeneration; and
- WHEREAS, the continued operation of this program is important to the White Mountain Apache Tribe in order to assure the regeneration of forested land and protection of resources during Prescribed Burning; and
- WHEREAS, the executed P.L. 93-638 Contract No. 145OCTH52T60727 will expire on December 31, 1994.
- BEIT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby requests an extension of P.L. 93-638 Contract No. 145OCTH52T60727 through calendar year 1995.
- BEIT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council that the Chairman or in his absence, the Vice Chairman or their designee is hereby authorized to negotiate and sign the aforementioned extension.

The foregoing resolution was on November 03, 1994, duly adopted by a vote of nine for and zero against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article IV, Section 1 (a), (b), (f), (h), (i), (t) and (u) of the Constitution of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe September 30, 1993, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on November 12, 1993, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
