## RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, Navajo County Sheriff Gary Butler, the Chairperson of the BIA sponsored Whiteriver Police Department Evaluation, has come before the Tribal Council this date to explain the findings and recommendations in the Police Department Evaluation Report; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council, after reviewing the Committee's Police Evaluation Report, concludes that the recommendations and findings therein should be adopted by the Tribal Council and that Chief Andrew Kane of the White Mountain Apache Tribal Police force should meet with the Law & Order Committee and thereafter meet with the Tribal Council to discuss an action plan to resolve the concerns set forth in the report and to implement the recommendations thereof.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby adopts the findings and recommendations outlined in the Police Evaluation Report submitted this date.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council that it hereby directs Chief Andrew Kane to meet with the Law & Order Committee for purposes of discussing the police evaluation report and thereafter to schedule a meeting with the Tribal Council to address an action plan to implement the recommendations and to meet the concerns and findings outlined in the Committee's Police Evaluation Report.

The foregoing resolution was on <u>January 12, 1995</u>, duly adopted by a vote of <u>eight</u> for and <u>zero</u> against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article IV, Section 1 (a), (i), (s), (t) and (u) of the Constitution of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe September 30, 1993, and approved by the Secretary of Interior on November 12, 1993, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
