## RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council, by previous Resolution, directed the Tribal Legal Department to meet with the Tribal Election Commission to study and advise the Tribal Council regarding redistricting District IV to accommodate two additional Council seats for District IV, so as to guarantee at least one representative for the communities of McNary-Honda and North Fork and to determine boundaries for the different communities comprising District IV; and
- WHEREAS, representatives of the McNary-Hondah Communities have requested that the Tribal Council appoint a member of their community to the Tribal Election Commission to insure representation for their community on the Election Commission as any redistricting plan involving District IV and two additional District IV Council members directly impacts on their community; and
- WHEREAS, Tribal member Gladys Bencomo, a representative of the McNary-Hondah community is recommended to be appointed to the Tribal Election Commission for the foregoing purposes; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council concurs in the recommendation.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby appoints Gladys Bencomo to the Tribal Election Commission effective immediately.

The foregoing resolution was on February 02, 1995, duly adopted by a vote of ten for and zero against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article IV, Section 1 (a), (i), (s), (t) and (u) of the Constitution of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe September 30, 1993, and approved by the Secretary of Interior on November 12, 1993, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48
