RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, wetlands occur where the water and the land meet to create areas of great ecological significance; and
- WHEREAS, wetlands provide direct benefits to the Apache people, including flood control, rich soils, and water filtration; and
- WHEREAS, wetlands provide habitat and sustenance for many species of animals, including elk, deer, and waterfowl; and
- WHEREAS, wetlands contain specially adapted plants, including many with medicinal properties and other cultural values, including the cattail; and
- WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe's Fort Apache Indian Reservation is blessed with a great number of wetlands; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council wishes to see that the health of these special places is maintained in accordance with the Tribe's goals for its Reservation; and
- WHEREAS, the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) of the United States Government provides grants to tribes to develop wetlands protection programs; and
- WHEREAS, it is a priority for the Tribe to assume authority of Section 404 of the Clean Water Act, which regulates certain activities that affect wetlands.
- BE IT RESOLVED, that the Tribal Council hereby approves the submission of a grant proposal by the Environmental Planning Office to the EPA to develop a Tribal wetlands plan.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the wetlands plan shall reflect Tribal concerns for these special places, and that the plan be integrated with ongoing planning efforts into a comprehensive Ecosystem Management Plan and Watershed Plans.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Tribe authorizes the Tribe's Legal and Planning Departments to seek assumption of Clean Water Act Section 404 program authority under the auspices of a Tribal Review and permitting process.
