RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the Arizona Commission on the Arts has invited applications for its Tribal Museum Program whereby 50% of the salary of the Museum Director will be paid by grant funds for up to three years; and
- WHEREAS, the construction and operation of the new White Mountain Apache Cultural Education Facility and Museum at Fort Apache will require professional expertise to develop and manage the facility; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council has declared that the preservation and display of the material of Apache Culture is of significance to the health and well being of the Tribe and Tribal members; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council desires that the highest level of professionalism be incorporated into the operation of the Tribal Museum.
- BEIT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby directs that an application be prepared and submitted to the Arizona Commission on the Arts for participation in the Tribal Museum Program.

The foregoing resolution was on <u>March 08, 1995</u>, duly adopted by a vote of <u>nine</u> for and <u>zero</u> against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article IV, Section 1 (a), (b), (g), (i), (j), (k), (s), (t) and (u) of the Constitution of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe September 30, 1993, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on November 12, 1993, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
