RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the Whiteriver Service Unit of the Indian Health Service is a primary provider of health care on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation; and
- WHEREAS, the Indian Health Service has established that the existing hospital at Whiteriver has inadequate space and staff to handle the present workload and has allowed the facility to enter Phase III of the Health Facilities Construction Priority System; and
- WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe has a young population that is increasing in numbers; and
- WHEREAS, there are nearly 400 deliveries per year among the user population of the Whiteriver Service Unit of which approximately 50% must be referred to other facilities; and
- WHEREAS, the Whiteriver Service Unit hospital could handle the majority of the deliveries that are referred out to other facilities if it has the proper facilities and staff; and
- WHEREAS, a full-service obstetrical program would save the Whiteriver Service Unit scarce financial resources by reducing the number of medical transports and contract health cost associated with deliveries; and
- WHEREAS, a full-service obstetrical program at the Whiteriver Hospital would provide a service that would allow for more family members to participate in the births of new family members.
- BEIT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby supports the completion of a Program Justification Document for the expansion and renovation of the entire Whiteriver Hospital to better serve the needs of the White Mountain Apache Tribe.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council that it hereby supports any interim measures that would immediately establish a full-service obstetrical unit at the Whiteriver Hospital to better serve the needs of the White Mountain Apache Tribe.
