- WHEREAS, Rueben Kessay has served in law enforcement at the Fort Apache Agency for more than 27 years; and
- whereas, throughout his career in law enforcement Mr. Kessay has provided law enforcement services to the people of this Tribe and its guests and visitors which meet the highest professional standards; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council wishes to acknowledge the outstanding work of Rueben Kessay, who is a member of the White Mountain Apache Tribe.
- BEIT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby offers its sincere appreciation and utmost gratitude to Mr. Rueben Kessay for his many years of law enforcement with the Fort Apache Agency.
- BEIT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council that it hereby wishes Mr. Kessay a joyful and productive retirement and that he may look back on his career with satisfaction for having completed a job well done.

The foregoing resolution was on <u>March 30, 1995</u>, duly adopted by a vote of <u>seven</u> for and <u>zero</u> against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article IV, Section 1 (a), (t) and (u) of the Constitution of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe September 30, 1993, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on November 12, 1993, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
