RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the Tribal Healthy Nations Project with funding assistance from the Robert Wood Johnson foundation has completed the planning phase of the Tribal campaign against alcohol and substance abuse; and
- WHEREAS, the application deadline for the implementation phase is June 1, 1995; and
- WHEREAS, the success in pulling together a wide spread and broad based community effort to combat alcohol use in Phase I indicates that the White Mountain Apache Tribe will effectively implement the program; and
- WHEREAS, alcohol abuse is the main source of many of the social and criminal problems occurring on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation.
- BEIT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby directs that an application be prepared and submitted to the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation for Phase II funding for the Healthy Nations Program.
- **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** by the Tribal Council that the Tribal Health Authority be authorized to negotiate the contract and implement the program on behalf of the Tribe.

The foregoing resolution was on <u>April 19, 1995</u>, duly adopted by a vote of <u>nine</u> for and <u>zero</u> against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article IV, Section 1 (a), (i), (j), (k), (m), (s), (t) and (u) of the Constitution of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe September 30, 1993, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on November 12, 1993, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
