RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is concerned that the approximately thirty FHA homes being financed on the Reservation may be subject to current or future foreclosure with the result that the homes and remaining leasehold interest could be sold to non-members of the Tribe; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council has previously authorized Revolving Credit and the Bureau of Indian Affairs to conduct appraisals of foreclosed FHA financed homes with the goal of purchasing said homes for resale to tribal members who qualify; and
- WHEREAS, there are approximately thirty remaining FHA financed homes on the Reservation and the Tribal Council concludes that it would be in the best interest of the Tribe if BIA would conduct an appraisal of those homes and that Revolving Credit purchase said homes at the appraised value for resale to tribal members.
- BEIT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby requests the Bureau of Indian Affairs to conduct an immediate appraisal of the remaining thirty FHA financed homes on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation.
- BEIT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council that it hereby authorizes and directs the Tribal Revolving Credit Department to purchase the remaining FHA financed homes at the appraised value thereof.

The foregoing resolution was on May 03, 1995, duly adopted by a vote of eight for and zero against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article IV, Section 1 (a), (h), (i), (k), (m), (s), (t) and (u) of the Constitution of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe September 30, 1993, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on November 12, 1993, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
