RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, Andrew Kane, Chief of Police, being duly recognizant of the budgetary guidelines, nonetheless faces a deadline of May 7, 1995 for ordering vehicles for FY 96 from the manufacturers; and
- WHEREAS, the police vehicles need to be replaced immediately, as the average vehicle now has in excess of 200,000 miles on it, not only representing a safety hazard to the police and the public, but also costing the Tribe about \$9700.00 a month in repair and towing costs; and
- WHEREAS, this amount of funds could be better allocated to purchasing 15 new vehicles which could be delivered in November of 1995.
- BEIT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby allow Chief Andrew Kane to order 15 new vehicles before May 7, 1995, at an amount not to exceed \$390,000.00 and that such amount shall be applied against the Tribal portion of the 1996 Police Department budget.

The foregoing resolution was on May 03, 1995, duly adopted by a vote of nine for and zero against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article IV, Section 1 (a), (b), (i), (k), (s), (t) and (u) of the Constitution of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe September 30, 1993, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on November 12, 1993, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
