RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Headstart Program has developed a program to teach parenting skills training to parents on the Reservation; and
- WHEREAS, the children on this Reservation are entitled to every advantage which their parents and other concerned adults have to offer; and
- WHEREAS, the Arizona Department of Economic Security has funding to pay the Tribe to provide such training for parents.
- BEIT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby authorizes the White Mountain Apache Headstart Program to enter into an Inter-Governmental Agreement with the Arizona Department of Economic Security to provide parenting skills training by Headstart on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation.
