RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council has this date reviewed the priorities for road development and improvements within the Fort Apache Indian Reservation; and
- WHEREAS, the Council is advised that the road bridge at Quintero Springs has washed away four times in recent years; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council has concluded that construction of a permanent and more durable bridge at Quintero Springs is needed to serve the residents who use the crossing and to save money which in the past has been used to repeatedly restore the present structure.
- **BE IT RESOLVED** by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby directs that the development and construction of a new and permanent bridge at Quintero Springs be identified as a priority for future ISTEA Transportation Enhancement Program projects.

The foregoing resolution was on <u>December 20, 1995</u> duly adopted by a vote of <u>eight</u> for and <u>zero</u> against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article IV, Section 1 (a), (c), (h), (j), (t) and (u) of the Constitution of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe September 30, 1993, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on November 12, 1993, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
