

**RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION**

WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Head Start Program provides early education services to 272 three and four-year-old children on the Reservation; and

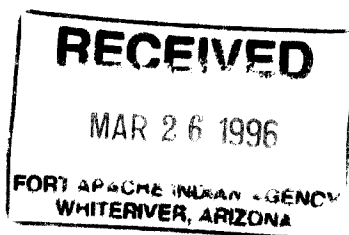
WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Head Start Program provides services to the entire family of the enrolled child; and

WHEREAS, one of the objectives of the White Mountain Apache Head Start Program is to facilitate family strength by providing services and activities that promote togetherness and teamwork; and


WHEREAS, the Tribal Council, in support of the White Mountain Apache Head Start efforts to promote a day dedicated to children and family unity, directs that May 11, 1996 be proclaimed as "Children's Day" by the White Mountain Apache Tribal Chairman, Ronnie Lupe.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby declares the weekend of May 11-12, 1996 to be "Head Start Weekend" and May 11, 1996 as "Children's Day."

The foregoing resolution was on March 13, 1996 duly adopted by a vote of seven for and zero against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article IV, Section 1 (a), (g), (i), (s), (t) and (u) of the Constitution of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe September 30, 1993, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on November 12, 1993, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
