

**RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION**

WHEREAS, the Budget and Finance Committee has been reviewing ways and methods of streamlining the tribal operations in an effort to reduce costs; and

WHEREAS, it is obvious that the current organizational structure mitigates against efficiency and direct accountability for day to day decisions of the central tribal units and tribal enterprises; and

WHEREAS, it is the view of the Budget and Finance Committee that efficiency, elimination of duplication, coordination of efforts, and accountability will be enhanced by an organizational structure that combines similar units into division whereby increased communication between and among units is a routine matter; and

WHEREAS, it is anticipated that a divisional organizational structure will promote individual creativity and allow leaders to arise precluding the immediate need for appointment of division heads; and

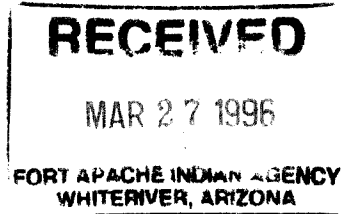
WHEREAS, the intent of the Budget and Finance Committee is that the responsible individuals of each unit combined into a given division will have regular meetings to identify problems, suggest solutions, and share items of mutual concern and interest requiring that a variety of points of view be exposed and considered for operational decisions; and

WHEREAS, the Budget and Finance Committee explored past attempts to reorganize tribal government, considered the missions of each unit and how they interrelate, and now recommends that the organization chart attached hereto be the Official Organizational Chart for the White Mountain Apache Tribe.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby accepts the recommendation of the Budget and Finance Committee and adopts the proposed attached Tribal Divisional Organizational Chart as the Official Organizational Chart for the White Mountain Apache Tribe, effective immediately.

The foregoing resolution was on March 13, 1996, duly adopted by a vote of eight for and zero against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by the White Mountain Apache Tribal Constitution, including Article IV, Sections 1 (a), (l), (s), (t) and (u) of the Constitution of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on September 30, 1993, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on November 12, 1993, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
