

**RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION**

- WHEREAS,** the Cibecue Community Education Board, Inc., hereinafter referred to as the Board was incorporated on March 22, 1984 under the White Mountain Apache Tribe of the Fort Apache Indian Reservation for the purpose of operating and managing the educational facilities of the community and to assist in the promotion of Kindergarten, primary, secondary, technical and vocational education and community development activities; and
- WHEREAS,** since 1984 Cibecue Community School, hereinafter referred to as the School, under the auspices of the Board has been provided the educational needs of the community and it's children who are in grades k-8th; and
- WHEREAS,** in 1991 the School further developed and implemented high school programs (9th-12th) for students who are in need of such services; and
- WHEREAS,** in February, 1996 the administrative staff of the School presented to the Board of Directors a proposal to develop a 2nd Chance Alternative Program to provide (1) a parenting program (both parents where possible) and day care program for teen parents who attend school; (2) a basic skills program for youth and young adults who test at or below the normal grade level in basic subjects, i.e. math, language arts, including reading comprehensive and writing skills; (3) a GED Program where youths may earn a GED certificate and at the same time obtain a high school diploma through Cibecue High School; (4) a parent literacy training program to help parents work with their children to improve their children's achievements; and (5) an after school program for the community's children; etc.
- WHEREAS,** the School and the Board realizes that the 2nd Chance Alternative Program needs one(1) to two(2) buildings assigned to the School to ensure full implementation of the Program; and
- WHEREAS,** the School and the Board have identified two(2) buildings located in Cibecue Community, about one(1) mile northeast of the School, currently under assignment to the JTPA Programs; and
- WHEREAS,** the School looked at a half-completed and empty buildings, more commonly referred to as "the blue building," and found that \$10,000 is needed to completed the renovation of the building for occupancy; and
- WHEREAS,** the School is willing and able to absorb the costs of renovation and maintenance of building; and

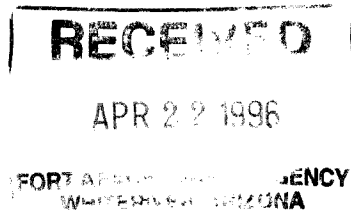
WHEREAS, the Cibecue Community Education Board, Inc., on behalf of the School is requesting the permanent assignment of "the blue building" which is located one(1) mile northeast of the School.


BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby approves the permanent reassignment of "the blue building" which is located one(1) mile northeast of the Cibecue Community School.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that all costs associated with the renovations, upkeep and maintenance of the building shall be the sole responsibility of the Cibecue Community School and the Cibecue Community Education Board, Inc.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that, if the building is not used for the purpose of providing the services as outlined in the proposal request, then the ownership of the building will revert back to the White Mountain Apache Tribe.

The foregoing resolution was on April 11, 1996, duly adopted by a vote of nine for and zero against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article IV, Section 1 (a), (h), (I), (k), (s), (t), and (u) of the Constitution of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe September 30, 1993, and approved by the Secretary of Interior on November 12, 1993, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
