

**RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION**

WHEREAS, the individual septic systems in place in the Community of Cedar Creek are experiencing failure at an alarming rate; and

WHEREAS, Cedar Creek has been designated as the area mostly suitable for future housing development requiring additional disposal of waste water; and

WHEREAS, after careful study, replacement of septic systems or additional septic systems appears to be a long term exercise in futility as the eventual failure is virtually assured; and

WHEREAS, the septic failures are creating an undue threat to the health and safety of community members and are creating a potential threat to the health of Cedar Creek, and;

WHEREAS, Chairman Lupe has determined that it is in the best interest of the White Mountain Apache Tribe to permanently solve the Problem; and

WHEREAS, a number of agencies have funds to construct a new sewer collection and disposal systems, although individually any one organization is unable to fully fund the project.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it authorizes the applications for funding a permanent solution to the Cedar Creek sewer problems.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED That Planning Department be directed to prepare and submit the applications for funding a permanent solution to the Cedar Creek sewer problems.


The foregoing resolution was on May 8, 1996, duly adopted by a vote of nine for and zero against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article IV, Section 1 (a), (b), (t), and (u) of the Constitution of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe September 30, 1993, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on November 12, 1993, pursuant to Section 15 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
