## RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, Chief of Police Andrew Kane has become before the Tribal Council requesting approval for the police department to be the lead agency for a grant which, if funded, would link all Indian police agencies in Arizona via a Satcom system network tied to a mainframe computer; and
- WHEREAS, said network would be for the sharing of information between user agencies via a PC; and
- WHEREAS, the system will have three levels of security and will only be accessible to designated agencies; and
- WHEREAS, the Intertribal Council will assist in the liaison with other agencies in establishing the hook ups, provide training for the system and assist in the grant proposal to the US Department of Justice; and
- WHEREAS, the level of funding, if granted, is approximately \$650,000.00; and
- WHEREAS, Chief Kane states that he will return to the Tribal Council for final approval but is only seeking authority now to apply for the grant and to begin the process.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby authorizes Chief of Police Andrew Kane, or his designee, to start the process for application of a grant to link all Indian police agencies in Arizona as described by Chief Kane.

The foregoing resolution was on <u>October 03, 1996</u>, duly adopted by a vote of <u>nine</u> for and <u>zero</u> against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article IV, Section 1 (a), (b), (i), (j), (k), (s), (t) and (u) of the Constitution of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe September 30, 1993, and approved by the Secretary of Interior on November 12, 1993, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
