

**RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION**

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council passed Resolution No. 08-96-181 directing the Tribal Environmental Planning Office to pursue funds for a Hondah-McNary Community Mapping and Planning Project; and

WHEREAS, an integral part of this project will be the ground surveying, aerial photography and generation of accurate maps of the Hondah-McNary area; and

WHEREAS, the U.S. Department of the Interior, Phoenix Area Office, Bureau of Reclamation, has worked with the Tribe and BIA, Fort Apache Agency, in the past on the Whiteriver Streets Pilot Mapping Project, and again desires to assist the Tribe with the mapping component of the Hondah-McNary Community Planning Project; and

WHEREAS, the Bureau of Reclamation has \$10,000 in cash and in-kind services available to put towards the project upon entering into a cooperative agreement with the Tribe.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby agrees to enter into a cooperative agreement with the U.S. Department of the Interior, Phoenix Area Office, Bureau of Reclamation, for purposes of undertaking and completing the Hondah-McNary Community Planning Project.


BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council that the scope of this work may be expanded to include a similar mapping project of the Cedar Creek community, upon securing funding to undertake this additional work.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council that the Tribal Environmental Planning Office is to coordinate work on the cooperative agreement, and that the Chairman, Vice Chairman, or their official designee is hereby authorized to negotiate terms of the contract and to enter into the contract by signature.

The foregoing resolution was on October 03, 1996, duly adopted by a vote of six for and zero against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by the White Mountain Apache Tribal Constitution, including Article IV, Sections 1 (a), (i), (j), (s), (t) and (u) of the Constitution of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on September 30, 1993, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on November 12, 1993, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
