

**RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION**

**WHEREAS**, tribal member Jackie Lee has come before the Tribal Council this date with the request that the Tribal Council approve her use of the Memorial Hall to sponsor a benefit concert for cancer patient D.J. Altaha, starring performer Ashley Lucas, to be held Saturday, May 3, 1997; and


**WHEREAS**, the Tribal Council concludes that approval should be granted to Ms. Lee to utilize the Memorial Hall on May 3, 1997 for the benefit concert, and that rent be waived for the use thereof.

**BE IT RESOLVED** by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby grants approval for tribal member Jackie Lee to use the Memorial Hall to sponsor a benefit concert for cancer patient D.J. Altaha, starring Ashley Lucas, to be held on May 3, 1997.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it directs Ms. Lee to contact Chief Kane of the Whiteriver Police Department so that the Police Department is alerted to the time and place of the benefit concert.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** by the Tribal Council that it hereby waives any rent requirement for the use of Memorial Hall for this particular benefit concert, but the concert sponsors shall be responsible for the clean-up of the Memorial Hall after the benefit concert and shall be responsible for any damage to Memorial Hall as a result of the benefit concert.

The foregoing resolution was on April 2, 1997 duly adopted by a vote of nine for and zero against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by the White Mountain Apache Tribe Constitution, including Article IV, Section 1 (a), (h), (i), (s), (t) and (u) of the Constitution of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe September 30, 1993, and approved by the Secretary of Interior on November 12, 1993, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
