## RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the Child Care and Development Funds (CCDF) provides funding to states, territories and federally recognized Indian Tribes to provide services to children from low income families; and
- WHEREAS, the CCDF requires the tribe to submit a child count certification; and
- WHEREAS, a child count has been obtained through the Office of Vital Records and the Department of Planning; and
- WHEREAS, the current child count of children under the age of 16 years living on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation has been determined to be 6,967; and
- **WHEREAS**, the CCDF further requires that the child count declaration be certified by the Tribal Council; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council agrees with the foregoing child count.
- **BE IT RESOLVED** by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby certifies that the current child count of children under the age of 16 years residing on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation is 6,967.

The foregoing resolution was on May 15, 1997, duly adopted by a vote of six for and zero against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by the White Mountain Apache Tribal Constitution, including Article IV, Sections 1 (a), (b), (j), (s), (t) and (u) of the Constitution of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on September 30, 1993, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on November 12, 1993, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
