RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the Child Care and Development Fund (CCDF) provides funding to states, territories and federally recognized Indian Tribes to provide services to children from low income families; and
- **WHEREAS,** the CCDF requires the tribe to develop Child Care Standards to meet; the health and safety requirements for the children; and
- WHEREAS, the Child Care Standards have been developed by the Child Care Program Coordinator with assistance from the IHS Office of Environmental Health, Fire Department, and Tribal Social Services; and
- **WHEREAS,** the CCDF further requires that the Child Care Standards be approved by the Tribal Council; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council agrees with the foregoing Tribal Child Care standards.
- **BE IT RESOLVED** by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby approves the Tribal Child Care Standards developed by the Child Care Program.

The foregoing resolution was on May 15, 1997, duly adopted by a vote of seven for and zero against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by the White Mountain Apache Tribal Constitution, including Article IV, Sections 1 (a), (b), (j), (s), (t) and (u) of the Constitution of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on September 30, 1993, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on November 12, 1993, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
