RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Head Start Program received an invitation to apply for ACF financial assistance to expand Head Start Enrollment; and
- WHEREAS, at present, the Head Start Program provides services to 252 four-year old children from income-eligible families; and
- WHEREAS, there are 339 three-year old children on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation, and the Head Start Program is unable to provide services to three-year old children due to funding limitations; and
- WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe recognizes and supports the need to expand Head Start services to three-year old children from income eligible families.
- .BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby supports and approves the submission of a grant application to expand Head Start services to include three-year old children from income-eligible families.

The foregoing resolution was on May 15, 1997, duly adopted by a vote of eight for and zero against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by the White Mountain Apache Tribal Constitution, including Article IV, Sections 7 (a), (b), (i), (j), (s), (t) and (u) of the Constitution of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on September 30, 1993, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on November 12, 1993, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
