## RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, The White Mountain Apache Tribe experiences about 65 injury accidents from motor vehicles annually; and
- WHEREAS, The White Mountain Apache Tribe averages 3 motor vehicle fatalities annually; and
- WHEREAS, The White Mountain Apache police average about 200 arrests annually for driving under the influence of liquor; and
- WHEREAS, Andrew Kane, Chief of Police of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, wishes to reduce the amount of injury and fatal accidents on the White Mountain Apache Reservation by initiating more traffic enforcement; and
- WHEREAS, The current radar sets of the police department cannot be repaired due to their age; and
- WHEREAS, The Office of Highway Safety of the Bureau of Indian Affairs is offering grant funds for traffic equipment in order to reduce the expenditures of the Tribal budget on police equipment; and
- WHEREAS, The Chief of Police requests the permission of the Tribal Council to apply for a grant to purchase radar sets and a portable lighting system to work traffic safety check points; and
- WHEREAS, The amount sought in this grant by the Police Department is \$12,225.
- **BE IT RESOLVED** by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it authorizes Chief Andrew Kane to proceed with the grant application to the Office of Highway Safety of the Bureau of Indian Affairs.

The foregoing resolution was on <u>June 11, 1997</u>, duly adopted by a vote of <u>nine</u> for and <u>zero</u> against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article IV, Section 1 (a), (b), (j), (t) and (u) of the Constitution of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on September 30, 1993, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on November 12, 1993, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
