RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe as the governing body of the White Mountain Apache Tribe is vitally concerned about the health and welfare of it's tribal members; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is aware of services provided to the Seriously Mentally Ill clients and desires to continue to obtain funds for Mental Health Services provided to Seriously Mentally Ill clients and their family members residing on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council has been notified of the request for obtaining continuing funds for the Psychosocial Rehabilitation Project; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council agrees that the Psychosocial Rehabilitation Project should be submitted to the Department of Health and Human Services, under the Public Health Services, and that Tribal Health Authority and Arizona's Department of Family and Community Medicine would continue to work together to manage the program.
- **BE IT RESOLVED** by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby directs the Tribal Health Authority to prepare the continuation grant application proposal for submission to the Department of Health and Human Services.

The foregoing resolution was on <u>June 11, 1997</u>, duly adopted by a vote of <u>eight</u> for and <u>zero</u> against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article IV, Section 1 (a), (b), (j), (t) and (t) of the Constitution of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on September 30, 1993, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on November 12, 1993, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
