RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, Tribal Member Patricia Nosie has come before the Tribal Council this date and advises the Tribal Council she believes she was wrongfully forced to resign her position in the Tribal Prosecution Department; and
- WHEREAS, Ms. Nosie is accompanied by her lay advocate Marjorie Grimes who also speaks on her behalf; and
- WHEREAS, Ms Nosie represents to the Tribal Council that she was found not guilty of assaulting a minor boy but was only convicted of criminal negligence; and
- WHEREAS, after a considerable discussion by the Tribal Council, questioning of the Tribal Prosecutor Sherry Martin regarding the events leading up to the request for Ms. Nosie's resignation, and the Tribal Council having concluded that Ms. Nosie should be reinstated to a position within the Tribal Legal Department, the Tribal Council being advised there being only one opening and that is for a recently vacated position for a Juvenile Court Advocate.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby directs that Ms. Patricia Nosie be reinstated to the Tribal Prosecution Department.

The foregoing resolution was on <u>August 6, 1997</u> duly adopted by a vote of <u>Six</u> for and <u>Zero</u> against and <u>Four</u> abstaining by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article IV, Section 1 (a), (i), (s) (t), and (u) of the Constitution of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe September 30, 1993, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on November 12, 1993, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
