RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is advised by the Chief Judge of the Tribal Court that there is a need to establish a Disciplinary Committee to review complaints against attorneys and lay advocates practicing before the White Mountain Apache Tribal Court; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is further advised that Section 2.28 of the Judicial Code provides for the Discipline of Counsel licensed to practice before the Tribal Court but does not provide for the establishment of a Disciplinary Committee; and
- WHEREAS, it is recommended to the Tribal Council that Section 2.28 of the Judicial Code be amended to establish a Disciplinary Committee; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council concurs with the recommendation and directs that the proposed amendments to the Judicial Code attached hereto be posted for public comment as required by the Constitution.
- **BE IT RESOLVED** by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby directs the Tribal Council Secretary to post the proposed amendments to the Judicial Code in each District for ten days as required by the Constitution.

The foregoing resolution was on November 6, 1997 duly adopted by a vote of eight for and zero against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article IV, Section 1 (a), (q), (t) and (u) of the Constitution of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe September 30, 1993, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on November 12, 1993, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
