

**RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION**

WHEREAS, members of the Fall family have returned to the Tribal Council to advise the Council that they still have a dispute with their neighbor Roger Lupe concerning the boundary line with which separates their two residences; and


WHEREAS, debris and manure from the Lupe residence is believed to be placed upon the Fall's residential lot; and

WHEREAS, through the assistance of the Bureau of Indian Affairs reported activity by Mr. Lupe will be reviewed under the BIA Employment Guidelines; and


WHEREAS, the parties desire to determine where the boundary line between the two residences is located.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby directs the Land office to immediately survey the boundary line between the Fall and the Lupe residences to determine the exact location of the boundary line.

The foregoing resolution was on July 8, 1998 duly adopted by a vote of six for and zero against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article IV, Section 1 (a),(e), (h), (t), and (u) of the Constitution of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe September 30, 1993, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on November 12, 1993, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
