

RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council has been advised by the Tribal Realty Specialist that there is currently no billing or tracking system for business lease payments made to the Tribe; and

WHEREAS, several businesses on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation are operating without a current lease, and many are not making required lease payments; and

WHEREAS, in order to insure the Tribe is receiving payments when due, it is suggested that a Lease Billing and Tracking System be initiated and administered by the Tribal Realty Office; and

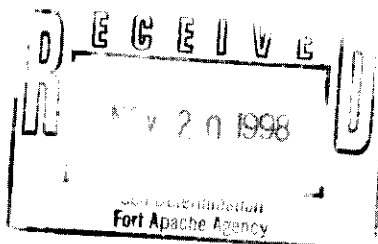
WHEREAS, the Tribal Data Processing Manager has been consulted to create a computer program for a billing and tracking system for lease management; and


WHEREAS, after discussion of this matter, the Tribal Council is of the opinion that a lease billing and tracking system should be initiated in order to maintain compliance of all business leases.


BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby approves the creation of a Tribal Business Lease Billing and Tracking System, to be administered by the Tribal Realty Office.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that once the program for the Lease Billing and Tracking System is completed by the Tribal Data Processing Manager, this system should commence immediately.

The foregoing resolution was on September 3, 1998, duly adopted by a vote of 6 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by the White Mountain Apache Tribal Constitution, including Article IV, Sections 1(a), (e), (h), (i), (s), (t) and (u) of the Constitution of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on September 30, 1993, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on November 12, 1993, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
