



**RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION**

- WHEREAS**, the members of the Tribal Council share a common goal of providing preventative services to members of the White Mountain Apache Tribe; and
- WHEREAS**, a preventative goal of Health People 2000 is to have 85% of women age fifty plus get a pap smear every two years; and
- WHEREAS**, only 25% of women age 50 plus of the White Mountain Apache Tribe have had a pap smear within the past two years; and
- WHEREAS**, early detection of precancerous lesions can actually prevent cervical cancer; and
- WHEREAS**, the Arizona Department of Health Services, Office of Prevention and Health Promotion, receives funding from the Centers of Disease Control to provide statewide breast and cervical cancer screening for women 50 and over; and
- WHEREAS**, the Arizona Department of Health Services, Well Women Health Check agrees to reimburse the White Mountain Apache Tribe up to \$36,251.00 a year for the next 5 years to provide direct services; and
- WHEREAS**, the White Mountain Apache Tribal Health Authority plans to provide this important and necessary health service with the limited funds.
- BE IT RESOLVED** by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby agrees to waive the indirect cost for \$11,250.00 to provide direct services for cancer screening.

The foregoing resolution was on February 5, 1999 duly adopted by a vote of eight for and zero against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article IV, Section 1 (a), (b), (i), (j), (k), (s), (t), and (u) of the Constitution of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe September 30, 1993, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on November 12, 1993, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
