

**RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION**

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council has heard a proposal from Sally Saltzman of the University of Arizona Cancer Center to make a film about the detection of breast cancer for Native American Women; and

WHEREAS, Ms. Saltzman proposes to make a film within the Fort Apache Indian Reservation using members of the community for the characters and production of the film; and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council has viewed a sample film on breast cancer detection which contains many similar scenes and elements as the proposed film; and

WHEREAS, the proposal has the support and endorsement of the Tribal Health Board; and


WHEREAS, the Tribal Council recognizes the benefit of a film production for Native American women which uses Native American subjects and portrays scenes familiar to women who reside upon Indian reservations; and


WHEREAS, the completed film would be reviewed by the Health Board upon its completion.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby grant permission to Sally Saltzman and the Arizona Cancer Center to make a film on the Reservation concerning the early detection of breast cancer.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the Health Board review the completed film before it is released.

The foregoing resolution was on August 12, 1999 duly adopted by a vote of seven for and zero against and one abstention by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article IV, Section 1 (a), (b), (g), (h), (s), (t), and (u) of the Constitution of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe September 30, 1993, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on November 12, 1993, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
