

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, pursuant to Resolution No. 12-95-387, dated December 20, 1995, the Tribal Council identified as a priority project, the development and construction of a new and permanent bridge at Quintero Springs; and

WHEREAS, the Bureau of Indian Affairs, Fort Apache Agency Branch of Roads, has requested a right-of-way for the purpose of constructing and maintaining a new permanent bridge at Quintero Springs; and

WHEREAS, said proposed right-of-way is for the purpose of constructing a permanent, more durable bridge at Quintero Springs to serve the residents, and will also save funds which in the past have been used to repeatedly restore the present bridge; and

WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe wishes to grant a gratuitous right-of-way 112 meters wide for a length of 175 meters, as shown of the right-of-way drawings referred to as R/W Dwg. No. FA-551-1 (revised).

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby grants the Bureau of Indian Affairs a gratuitous right-of-way as described herein and recorded on Right-of-Way Drawing No. FA-551-1 (revised).

The foregoing resolution was on August 13, 1999 duly adopted by a vote of NINE for and ZERO against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article IV, Section 1 (a), (b), (h), (i), (t) and (u) of the Constitution of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe September 30, 1993, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on November 12, 1993, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
