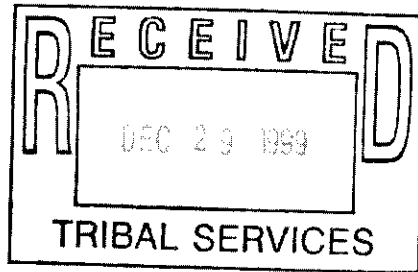


**RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION**

- WHEREAS**, the Tribal Council is advised of the urgent need to update Fort Apache Reservation census information; and
- WHEREAS**, in accordance with the April 1994 White House Memorandum on "Government to Government Relations with Tribal Governments" and the "American Policy of the U.S. Department of Commerce," the Census Bureau recognizes the unique and direct legal relationship between the U.S. Government and Indian Tribes; and
- WHEREAS**, the Census Bureau has committed to a program for establishing direct partnerships with tribal governments for Tribal Complete Count Committees; and
- WHEREAS**, for the purpose of Census 2000, each tribal government has been invited to appoint a Tribal Complete Count Committee to conduct a Census 2000 awareness campaign throughout the tribe's jurisdiction; and
- WHEREAS**, based on census data, funding is allocated by Congress annually for programs which provide services to the Tribe; and
- WHEREAS**, the 2000 Census Count will result in a statistical compilation which will be utilized in allocating federal funds and proper legislative representation to the White Mountain Apache Tribe; and
- WHEREAS**, the Tribal Council fully support the Census 2000 Count and the appointment of a Tribal Complete Count Committee.
- BE IT RESOLVED** by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it fully supports the Census 2000 count and urges everyone to participate in Census 2000 in order to obtain a complete and accurate census count.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby appoints the following persons to serve on the Tribal Complete Count Committee: Lavina Pina, Pastor Odell, Perida Moody, Lula Ivins, Andrew Kinney, Jr., Sarita Burnette, Jim Hall, Jonathan Baylish and Vanta Dahkoshay.

The foregoing resolution was on November 5, 1999, duly adopted by a vote of EIGHT for and ZERO against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article IV, Section 1 (a), (f), (r), (s), (t) and (u) of the Constitution of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on September 30, 1993, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on November 12, 1993, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
