

**RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION**

WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe has requested Federal Grant monies to build community buildings; and

WHEREAS, the Community Prevention Committee (CPC), made up of a multi-disciplinary team encompassing the Police, Detention, Prosecution, Schools, Child Welfare, Rainbow Treatment Center, and Apache Behavioral Health, has met to try and resolve each community's law, order, and safety concerns; and

WHEREAS, the CPC believes that these new buildings will be instrumental in helping resolve each community's concerns, such as providing space for the promotion of community prosecution, AA meetings, Parenting Classes, DV Counseling Classes, Police Substations, Probation check-ins, and other services which will help increase the sense of safety in each community on the Reservation; and

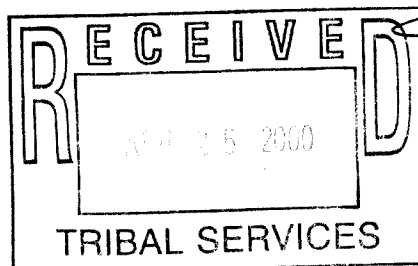
WHEREAS, the CPC believes such continual usage of these facilities will help keep them well maintained; and


WHEREAS, the Council is committed to the usage of these buildings by the various social, community, and cultural services available on the Reservation.


WHEREAS, the CPC believes that to further the above goals it is necessary to mandate that the buildings be used for such purposes.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it is mandated that any and all community buildings mentioned above be used by the various agencies mentioned above to further the resolution of each individual community's law, order, and safety concerns.

The foregoing resolution was on April 19, 2000 duly adopted by a vote of **FIVE** for, **ZERO** against and **ONE** abstention by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article IV, Section 1 (a), (b), (i), (j), and (u) of the Constitution of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe September 30, 1993, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on November 12, 1993, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
