

**RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION**

**WHEREAS,** the Fort Apache Indian Reservation does not have a complete street address system in place; and

**WHEREAS,** the population and housing on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation has increased substantially since the last Tribal Council Resolution (Resolution No. 02-95-046, February 2, 1995) adopting the street address system and authorizing that the necessary non-tribal funding be sought to implement the system (purchase and installation of street signs); and

**WHEREAS,** the need for a complete street address system throughout the Fort Apache Indian Reservation is vital for providing emergency services for residents and visitors of the Reservation; and

**WHEREAS,** the need for a complete street address system throughout the Fort Apache Indian Reservation is also vital for providing essential non-emergency services (utilities, telephones, UPS and mail delivery, etc.) for residents and visitors of the reservation; and

**WHEREAS,** the Enhanced 911 system requires a complete street address system for the Fort Apache Indian Reservation; and

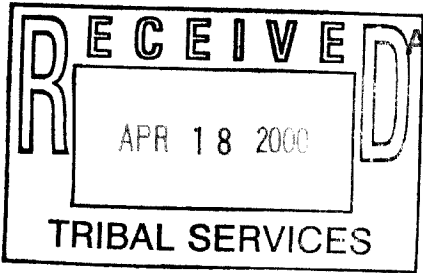
**WHEREAS,** the Tribal Police and Fire & Rescue Departments have developed a reservation-wide complete street address system.

**BE IT RESOLVED** by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby approves application to the Department of Health and Human Services, Indian Health Service for an Injury Prevention Grant which will be used for the 911 Address System.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it herein affirms and demonstrates its commitment to sustaining the program elements set into place under this program after the conclusion of the proposed three year project period and that the Tribe will work to secure funding to ensure that the program elements are maintained into the future.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the Tribal Chairman or his designee is authorized to sign all documents needed to submit the applications to IHS.

The foregoing resolution was on April 7, 2000 duly adopted by a vote of SIX for and ZERO against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article IV, Section 1 (i) of the Constitution of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe September 30, 1993, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on November 12, 1993, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
