

**RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION**

**WHEREAS,** the federal Centers for Disease Control have announced a fiscal year 2000 grant program to assist in the prevention of what is termed sexual violence and intimate partner violence among ethnic minority populations; and

**WHEREAS,** this grant program is opened to applications from organizations serving ethnic minority population including Native American populations; and

**WHEREAS,** the Navajo County University of Arizona Cooperative Extension, working in coordination with the Whiteriver Unified School District is submitting an application for an award for grant funds to bring the benefits of this program to the Whiteriver community; and

**WHEREAS,** the Navajo County University of Arizona Cooperative Extension wishes to acquire available office space within the Reservation for its program; and

**WHEREAS,** the Tribal Council has taken other measures to address problems of domestic violence within our communities, and wishes to utilize this program to further combat the problem of violence in families and among couples; and

**WHEREAS,** the Tribal Council supports and endorses the grant application to be submitted by the Navajo County University of Arizona Cooperative Extension, in cooperation with the Whiteriver Unified School District.

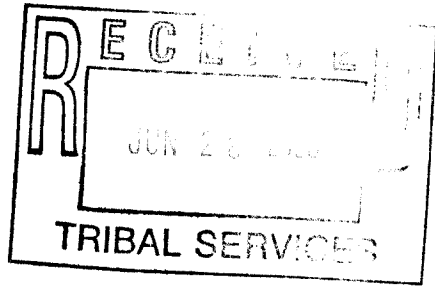
**BE IT RESOLVED** by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby endorses and supports the grant application to be submitted by the Navajo County University of Arizona Cooperative Extension in cooperation with the Whiteriver Unified School District, Middle School to the Healthy People 2010 grant program administers by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby encourages the Cooperative Extension search for office space within the Reservation.
