

**RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION**

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council has heard testimony this day from Gary Hill regarding his employment at the Tribal Forestry Department and the facts surrounding his termination of employment with the Department; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Hill has advised the Council that he did not seek a grievance with the Tribal Employee Grievance Committee because of family issues which required his full attention; and


WHEREAS, the Tribal Council, after hearing Mr. Hill's testimony, believes that the Tribal Employee Grievance Committee should have the opportunity to fully review Mr. Hill's grievance and determine whether his termination was made according to Tribal policy; and


WHEREAS, the Tribal Council wishes to provide Mr. Hill the opportunity to have a grievance hearing based upon the testimony he has given to the Council.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby refers Mr. Gary Hill to the Tribal Employee Grievance Committee for their consideration of his employment grievance.

BE IT FUTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it authorizes the Grievance Committee to provide Mr. Gary Hill a Grievance hearing according to its established procedure, and the time for determining the proper filing of such grievance shall run as if Mr. Hill's complaint began July 13, 2000.

The foregoing resolution was on July 13, 2000, duly adopted by a vote of TEN for and ZERO against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article IV, Section 1 (a), (s), (t) and (u) of the Constitution of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on September 30, 1993, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on November 12, 1993, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
