WHEREAS, the Tribal Council expresses its sympathy to the family of JoAnn Altaha; and

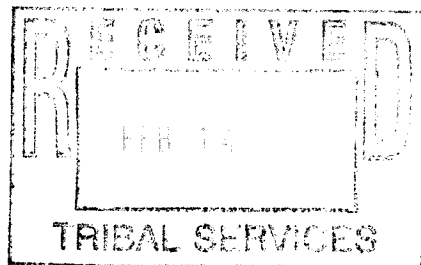


WHEREAS, the family of the late JoAnn Altaha request that she be buried in Whiteriver, Arizona.


BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby extends its sincere sympathies to the family on the passing of JoAnn Altaha .

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby grants approval for JoAnn Altaha to be buried on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation.

The foregoing resolution was on January 4, 2001, duly adopted by a vote of SEVEN for and ZERO against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article IV, Section 1 (a), (h), (t) and (u) of the Constitution of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on September 30, 1993, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on November 12, 1993, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
