

**RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION**

WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe has participated in a nationwide effort to develop a Watershed Analysis and Management (WAM) methodology for Indian country; and

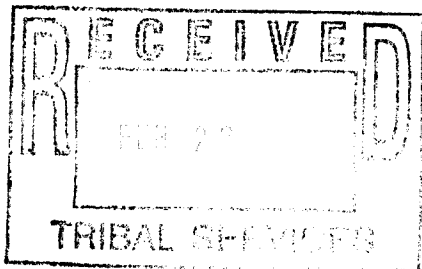
WHEREAS, Jonathan Long and Laurel Lacher, Tribal employees in the Watershed and Hydrology programs are developing a training program based on this methodology; and


WHEREAS, the goal of this program is to encourage Tribal members to lead watershed projects and to pursue higher education in watershed-related fields.


BE IT RESOLVED that the Watershed Program is directed to seek supplemental funding from appropriate funding sources to coordinate a training program for Tribal members from White Mountain and from other tribes in Arizona.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Program shall coordinate with the Wildlife and Outdoor Recreation Division for the use of facilities to conduct the training program.

The foregoing resolution was on January 4, 2001 duly adopted by a vote of SIX for and ZERO against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article IV, Section 1 (a), (f), (j), (s), (t), and (u) of the Constitution of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe September 30, 1993, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on November 12, 1993, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
