


**RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION**

- WHEREAS**, the White Mountain Apache Tribal Council has received notice from Tribal Council Member Mariddie Craig that Native Visions, a youth sports and motivational camp for Indian children across the country has notified her of their interest to hold their annual *Native Vision Sports and Life Skills Camp* in Whiteriver for a third consecutive year; and
- WHEREAS**, the goals of this program are to enhance self-esteem for youth and provide positive group experiences and life skills training and education; and
- WHEREAS**, it is expected that many youth from within the Fort Apache Indian Reservation and other Indian communities in the Southwest will attend this important retreat; and
- WHEREAS**, many professional and collegiate athletes will come to the event to volunteer their time for youth; and
- WHEREAS**, the Tribal Council supports the goals of this event of promoting "healthy minds, healthy bodies and healthy families."

**BE IT RESOLVED** by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby endorses and permits the location of the Native Vision Summer Youth program within the Fort Apache Reservation, specifically in Whiteriver.

The foregoing resolution was on January 9, 2002 duly adopted by a vote of EIGHT for and ZERO against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article IV, Section 1 (a), (s), (t) and (u) of the Constitution of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe September 30, 1993, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on November 12, 1993, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
