

**RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION**

**WHEREAS**, with the consistent support and encouragement of the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, and in full accord with the 1993 *Master Plan for the Fort Apache Historic Park, Nohwike' Bagowa*, The White Mountain Apache Culture Center and Museum has made consistent progress toward the establishment of the White Mountain Apache Tribe as a recognized leader in the fields of community based cultural conservation, historic preservation, and tourism-oriented economic development; and

**WHEREAS**, *Nohwike' Bagowa* exists, in part, to preserve and encourage the perpetuation of *Ndee* art and culture; and

**WHEREAS**, Demonstrations of *Ndee* art by *Ndee* artists serve as a valuable tool for introducing White Mountain Apache people and off-reservation visitors to *Ndee* art and culture; and

**WHEREAS**, the promotion of White Mountain Apache art is consistent with the cultural perpetuation and economic development goals of the White Mountain Apache Tribe for *Nohwike' Bagowa* and the Fort Apache Historic Park, broadly defined; and

**WHEREAS**, the Arizona Commission on the Arts (A.C.A.) offers matching grant funding to support arts demonstrations in Arizona communities; and

**WHEREAS**, the White Mountain Apache Tribe and the A.C.A. have maintained a consistent partnership in the support of *Ndee* arts.

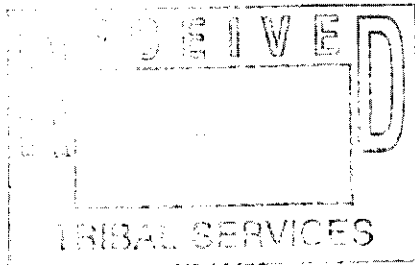
**BE IT RESOLVED** by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby authorizes and endorses the *Nohwike' Bagowa* initiative to secure A.C.A. Program Grant funding to support one half of the costs of a program of weekly arts demonstrations during July and August 2002 and June 2003 entitled *Ndee Arts: Apache Arts Demonstrations at Nohwike' Bagowa*.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby appoints Dr. Karl Hoerig, the Tribe's Museum Director, as the Tribe's agent to assist the Chairman in conducting all negotiations and in executing and submitting all documents, including application materials, billing statements, progress reports, etc., as required for the completion of *Ndee Arts: Apache Arts Demonstrations at Nohwike' Bagowa*.


**Resolution No. 03-2002-52**

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that *Nohwike' Bagowa*, The White Mountain Apache Cultural Center and Museum is to comply fully with all applicable tribal, federal, and state regulations, policies, guidelines, and requirements relating to the application and the resultant project.

The foregoing resolution was on March 6, 2002, duly adopted by a vote of TEN for and ZERO against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article IV, Section 1 (a), (b), (g), (h), (i), (j), (k), (s), (t) and (u) of the Constitution of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on September 30, 1993, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on November 12, 1993, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
