

**RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION**

- WHEREAS**, the White Mountain Apache Tribal Council has the power to act in all matters that concern the welfare of the Tribe and its members; and
- WHEREAS**, the Tribal Council previously approved the presence on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation of Master Jon Yi's Arizona Tae Kwon Do Center to provide education to tribal members on the practice of Tae Kwon Do; and
- WHEREAS**, the Tribal Council is pleased to learn from Councilmember Judy Dehose that Master Lee has selected 25 tribal members to travel to South Korea for a multi-week training session to immerse them in the Tae Kwon Do program along with the traditions and culture which formed the foundations of Tae Kwon Do; and
- WHEREAS**, the Tribal Council is pleased to learn that the students of Master Lee's Cibecue class will participate in competitions while in South Korea and may receive presidential medals and other honors and awards for their efforts; and
- WHEREAS**, the 25 students require travel funding in the amount of no less than \$2,650 for their round trip expenses to travel to South Korea; and
- WHEREAS**, the Tribal Council is aware that due to time constraints, the Cibecue students do not have adequate time to raise funds for their trip, but hereafter all students will participate in fundraising activities designed to raise the full amount of funding required for their travel; and
- WHEREAS**, the Tribal Council finds invaluable this opportunity for the 25 students of Tae Kwon Do to expand their knowledge of the self defense practice and to develop their social interactions and cultural awareness while boosting their personal development and self confidence; and
- WHEREAS**, the Tribal Council is honored to sponsor the 25 students in their travel to, and sponsored activities in, South Korea - and sends these students as ambassadors of good will from the White Mountain Apache Tribe to South Korea in appreciation of the South Korean government's recognition of the White Mountain Apache Tribe as an equal sovereign, which such appreciation shall be noted in a Proclamation of the Tribal Council which shall accompany the students in their travels to South Korea.
- BE IT RESOLVED** by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby authorizes financial assistance to the 25 Cibecue students enrolled in Master Lee's Tae Kwon Do class in Cibecue, listed in the attached roster, in the amount of \$200 per student.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it endorses the attached Proclamation of the White Mountain Apache Tribe declaring the 25 students listed in the attached roster as goodwill ambassadors to South Korea on behalf of the White Mountain Apache Tribe and as an expression of gratitude to

the government of South Korea for its desire to support cross-cultural experiences for members of the White Mountain Apache Tribe and for engaging the Tribe as an equal sovereign.

The foregoing resolution was on March 21, 2002 duly adopted by a vote of SEVEN for and ZERO against and ZERO abstention by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article IV, Section 1 (a), (h), (k), (s), (t) and (u) of the Constitution of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe September 30, 1993, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on November 12, 1993, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
