

**RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION**

WHEREAS, Tribal Member Jonathan Baylish, in executive session, has described for the Council the difficulty he faces with unemployment; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Baylish described the reasons for his resignation from a prior position with the Tribe more than one year ago; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Baylish seeks assistance from the Council for finding employment; and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council notes that the community prosecutor position within the Tribal Prosecution Unit is vacant; and

WHEREAS, it is recommended that Mr. Baylish would serve as a good community prosecution representative; and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Attorney has advised that the job description for the community prosecution position is being re-written, and the position will need to be posted with screening done to verify applicants meet the requirements of the job description and the Department of Justice funding requirements; and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council recognizes the contributions Mr. Baylish could bring to such a position, and would like assistance provided to Mr. Baylish in applying for and seeking the community prosecution position, or any other appropriate position within the Tribe which could utilize Mr. Baylish's skills.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby directs the Legal Department and Prosecution Unit to meet with Mr. Baylish to assist Mr. Baylish in evaluating the vacant Community Prosecution position to see if it meets with his qualifications and background.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that in the event the Community Prosecutor position is not appropriate, that full consideration will be given to Mr. Baylish for other appropriate positions within the Tribe which may utilize Mr. Baylish's skills.

The foregoing resolution was on May 17, 2002 duly adopted by a vote of nine for and zero against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article IV, Section 1 (a), (s), (t), and (u) of the Constitution of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe

September 30, 1993, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on November 12, 1993, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
