

**RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION**

WHEREAS, the western portion of the White Mountain Apache homeland has been significantly damage resulting from the Rodeo-Chediski Fire Complex in June, 2002; and

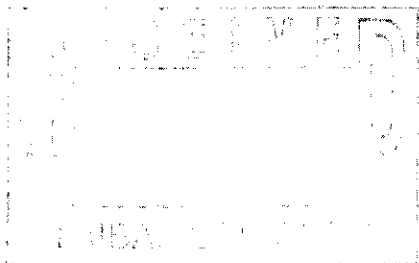
WHEREAS, the Little Colorado River Plateau Resource Conservation and Development Council of Northern Arizona wishes to seek partnership with the White Mountain Apache Tribe and the Fort Apache Bureau of Indian Affairs Agency to document the reclamation process of the fire under the Natural Resources Conservation Services, Emergency Watershed Protection Program on the Reservation and on the Tonto National Forest; and

WHEREAS, the proposed video will be a valuable educational tool for the Tribal public and others and that the Tribe will not be obligated to contribute any monetary funds towards the video; and


WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribal Chairman, Vice-Chairman, and Tribal Council viewed the Video.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby approves the release of the Video for general public review.

The foregoing resolution was on February 6, 2003 duly adopted by a vote of SIX for and ZERO against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article IV, Section 1 (a), (s), (t), and (u) of the Constitution of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe September 30, 1993, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on November 12, 1993, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
