## RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- **WHEREAS,** the White Mountain Apache Tribal Council is duly authorized to approve and execute grant applications submitted on behalf of tribal departments; and
- WHEREAS, the Office of English Language Acquisition (OLEA) is providing grants that support language instruction education programs for limited English proficient children from Native American, Alaska Native, Native Hawaiian and Native American Pacific Islander backgrounds; and
- WHEREAS, Northern Arizona University-College of Education and the Education Department of the White Mountain Apache Tribe desire to form a partnership to deliver a field-based collaboration program comprised of academic intervention, parent involvement, and teacher professional development; and
- WHEREAS, the following schools have submitted their letters of support to participate in the program: Theodore Roosevelt School, John F. Kennedy School, Cibecue Community School and the Office of Indian Education Programs.
- **BE IT RESOLVED** by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby supports the "Enabling Apaches to Gain Linguistic Education" (EAGLE) proposal being submitted to the U.S. Department of Education Office of English Language Acquisition.

The foregoing resolution was on <u>February 12, 2003</u>, duly adopted by a vote of <u>SEVEN</u> for and <u>ZERO</u> against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article IV, Section 1 (a, (s), (t) and (u) of the Constitution of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on September 30, 1993, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on November 12, 1993, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
