

**RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION**

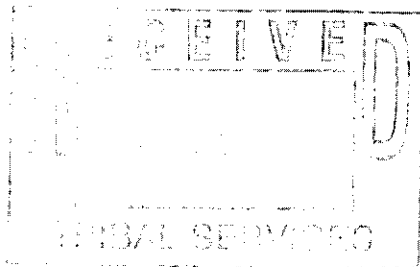
WHEREAS, the Tribal Council has been approached by White Mountain Apache Tribe Department of Youth Services, requesting support of the White Mountain Apache Tribal Youth Council's IHS grant application for the project: White Mountain Apache Youth Initiative (AYI): Substances Abuse Prevention – Apache Life Skills, which will provide youth focus groups, life skills classes, and drug-free activities; and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council recognizes the need of developing tribal youth programs that will address substance abuse prevention and other pertinent issues facing youth; and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Youth Council and the Department of Youth Services is designed to serve the needs of youth through activities and programs that promote a health lifestyle and drug-free communities.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby supports the efforts of the Tribal Youth Council and Youth Services in the development of substance abuse prevention programs, in particular the project: White Mountain Apache Youth Initiative: Substance Abuse Prevention – Apache Life Skills, and it supports and authorizes the Department of Youth Services to submit a grant application to the Indian Health Services for funding.

The foregoing resolution was on May 14, 2003 duly adopted by a vote of TEN for and ZERO against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article IV, Section 1 of the Constitution of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe September 30, 1993, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on November 12, 1993, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
