

**RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION**

WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribal Council has received the report of District I Councilman Jacob Henry on the need for street lights in Cibecue for the safety of all community members and the traveling public; and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council understands that preliminary estimates find that 32 street lights in Cibecue along its major roadways and pedestrian paths will help provide security and safety to the resident and traveling public in Cibecue; and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council understands that Navopache Electric Cooperative has agreed to provide, install and power the 32 street lights for an estimated \$224.40 per month pursuant to the terms of a one year automatically renewable security light service contract; and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is aware, through Councilman Jacob Henry, that the Navajo County Board Supervisor Jerry Brownlow has indicated Navajo County may contribute funds for the street lights; and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council finds that security and safety of community members and the traveling public near and on roads on trust lands within the Fort Apache Indian Reservation is one element of the Bureau of Indian Affairs' trust responsibility for development and maintenance of roads therein.

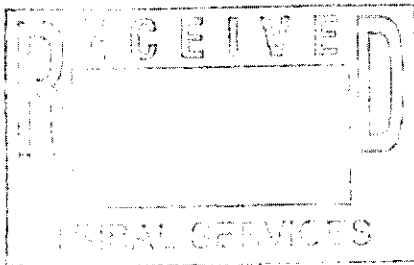
BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby endorses the request from District I Councilman Jacob Henry that the Tribe negotiate and permit installation of 32 street lights within the Cibecue community at locations most appropriate for the safety of the residents and the traveling public therein.


BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby requests that the Fort Apache Agency Superintendent allocate from the Agency's road account sufficient funding required to satisfy all expenses incurred in the installation, maintenance and power necessitated by the presence of 32 new street lights in Cibecue.


BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it does not intend, through this Resolution, to remove funding obligations from existing projects and programs for which the Fort Apache Agency is currently responsible.
