

**RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION**

**WHEREAS**, by virtue of the Tribe's inherent sovereignty over the lands and waters of the Fort Apache Indian Reservation, in addition to the powers listed in the Tribal Constitution, the Tribal Council has authority and responsibility to protect and promote the health of tribal ecosystems; and

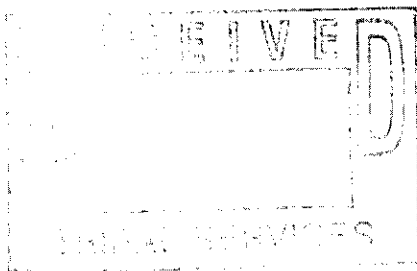
**WHEREAS**, through the implementation of the Land Restoration Code, using the Permanent Land Restoration Fund, the Land Restoration Board, has by a vote of seven (7) in favor and zero (0) against recommended two additional projects: the West End Wetland/spring Fencing Project and Farmland Protection in Carrizo Watershed for Tribal Council approval based on the Permanent Land Restoration Fund 2002 net income; and

**WHEREAS**, the proposed restoration projects will be funded by the Permanent Land Restoration Fund for the 2003-2004 fiscal year; and

**WHEREAS**, the proposed restoration projects will extend ongoing restoration efforts through physical restoration of important waters and farmland.

**BE IT RESOLVED** by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby approves the following restoration projects: West End Wetland/Spring Fencing Project and Farmland Protection in Carrizo Watershed.

The foregoing resolution was on September 9, 2003 duly adopted by a vote of TEN for and ZERO against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article IV, Section 1 (a), (c), (f), (s), (t), and (u) of the Constitution of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe September 30, 1993, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on November 12, 1993, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
